Career Steps



Obtain your nursing degree (diploma, BSN, or higher) and pass the NCLEX exam. Obtain your RN license through your State Board of Nursing and begin practicing in pediatrics.



Seek your Certified Pediatric Nurse (CPN) credential from PNCB when you meet eligibility. As you grow in your role, explore ways to get involved with quality improvement projects or teams.



Obtain your master's degree or post-masters certificate with a Clinical Nurse Leader Focus from an accredited university. Your program should be aligned with the American Association of Colleges of Nursing Clinical Nurse Leader Competencies.



Join a membership association as a student, like the Clinical Nurse Leader Association to access resources and mentors.



Complete a minimum of 400 program supervised clinical hours required to sit for the Clinical Nurse Leader Certification Exam. Pass the Clinical Nurse Leader certification exam.
